UAV's - Drones

• Additional Program Information

Both military and civilian aircraft often run into situations where their own-ship sensors become ineffective or unusable due to undercast weather or a need to standoff from the sensing objective for safety or other operational reasons. One way these limitations can be overcome is by launching small UAVs from the aircraft, which may in fact be another UAV, and having them fly under the weather or close to the objective.

This is a very challenging problem involving multiple technical disciplines. Tubes significantly constrain the amount of capability that can be put into the UAV including endurance, speed, sensor quality, and communications range requiring a very tightly integrated UAV design to ensure at least all performance thresholds are met. Furthermore, if the mothership has its own mission systems, this capability is best well integrated into the mothership in a way that the use of the UAV sensor looks and feel like their own-ship sensors. This presents an automation and human-machine interface challenge.

The main focus of the discussion will be on the communications challenges associated with

commanding and controlling the UAV as well as sending high bit rate payload data such as 720p video from significant distances under challenging spectrum conditions while both the UAV and the mothership are maneuvering significantly relative to one another. While the focus will be on the communications challenges, the negative impacts to speed, endurance, and costs associated with meeting the communications performance objectives with high reliability will also be addressed to demonstrate the systems thinking, planning, and trades that must be accomplished to deliver an operational system that meets all performance thresholds and/or objectives.

The Meeting was called to order at 7:40 by the President.

Communication Center Battery Back-up. Dr. Gregg Goffe proposed setting up a battery back-up system for the clubhouse stations. This would provide uninterrupted power while waiting for an emergency generator to arrive. The system would include some deep cycle marine batteries wired in parallel (for current capacity) and an inverter. Greg also proposed installing some efficient LED lighting. The system will cost a few hundred dollars and the plan was well received by the members present. Greg, who has installed a similar system at his home ham shack, will prepare a detailed plan for the club stations.

"Winter" Field Day. Eric Vinande proposed that BARC participate in the upcoming "Winter" Field Day to be held 30-31 January 2016. The event is sponsored by the Winter Field Day Association. BARC could operate inside or outside (in the fenced area adjacent to the clubhouse) using normal rooftop antennas. The event held outside will provide experience in emergency operations in cold weather conditions (but is not required). Eric will continue to pursue the possibility.

County **Emergency Preparedness** Greene Committee Meeting. GCARES & BARC will host the next quarterly meeting of the Greene County Emergency Preparedness Committee at the BARC Clubhouse & Communication Center November 12th from 2:00-3:30 PM. Greene County ARES EC Fred Stone will present an overview of ARES and the capabilities of the BARC Comm Center operation during a disaster or communication emergency. Fred request a couple BARC member to assist in greeting Committee members and showing them through the Commnication Center. Twelve to twenty people are expected to attend.

Leak in Ceiling. Chris Stauter noted that a ceiling tile was found soaking wet. The building superintendent will need to be informed.

Door for Roof Access. Henry Bussey proposed that BARC consider talking with the school superintendent about installing a door on the third floor to provide easier access to the roof. The general consensus was that the need is not critical and the cost, which would have to ensure that building and fire codes are met, could not be justified. The proposal was tabled.

Antenna Project. Larry Darner KD8RER (not present) had sent out an e-mail detailing the project status to date. Efforts to continue setting up a work party for completion are underway.

It was suggested this evening that a second conduit for antenna cables be installed adjacent to the existing conduit. This would eliminate the need to pull out the existing wire in order to facilitate installation of additional cables. This will also add capacity to the system. There were no objections to this plan of action.

It was suggested, by Jim Tiderman N8IDS, that BARC use the recently refurbished grey rotor for the Tower 2 antenna project. Fred Stone recommended purchasing a number of rotor wire pigtails for rotor installation both on the roof and in the clubhouse. The clubhouse side pigtails will facilitate interchange between the various stations. Five pigtail sets at \$22 each will be needed. The membership present concurred with the pigtail recommendation.

Nominations Committee Report. Nominees are still needed for President, Vice President and Jr. Director. The Nominations Committee is to report the slate of candidates at the November General Membership Meeting.

Future Meeting Program. Eric Vanande offered to give a presentation on more **Raspberry PI** ham radio applications. Given the current meeting program schedule, either the January, February or April meetings are possible time slots for Eric's program.

Clubhouse Station HF Upgrade Proposal. It was proposed that a high end HF rig (~\$3k) be purchased for the Comm Center. This would be useful for advanced filtering where QRM is problematic during attempted DX contacts. Alternatively, two medium price (e.g. Kenwood 590 @ ~\$1.5k each) could be purchased. This proposal could be funded by the sale of BARC's Drake equipment. Otherwise, the existing Kenwood 570 rig would have to be repaired. This existing Kenwood has been experiencing problems and currently not functioning.

There were mixed responses on both the need for a higher end rig or the sale of the Drake station. It was decided that a committee be formed, led by station coordinator Eric Vinande, to research the viability of the proposal, the options and the alternatives.

2016 Functional Coordinators and Chairmen. Fred stone will continue as the Emergency Coordinator and the Newsletter Coordinator for 2016 but would like to transfer the Education Coordinator position to another member. Don Parker will assume the overall Public Service Functional Coordinator position. Darryl Fowler KD8JQE (not present) has indicated that he would keep Field Day Committee chairmanship and also continue to coordinate the Little Miami River Kleeners (LMRK) event. All other functional coordinators will need to

reaffirm (or decline) their continued service in their current role.

Miscellaneous Action Items for Fred Stone.

- Contact Dan Kenney concerning the gravel bed for the repeater emergency generator.
- Remove the radios in the trailer soon.
- Check this coming Sunday on how many students are interested in the free HT incentive so that Paul may effect the radio purchase.

Fred also suggested using a large capped PVC pipe section to store the fence posts used for safety marking the Field Day antenna array.

Treasurer's Report. Paul Sharp inquired as to the status of the repeater hardline for purchase. Russ Roysden was not present to comment on the purchase of the new hardline. Fred Stone anticipated that Dan probably would prefer to postpone the tower climb until spring. Paul also noted the following expenses (pending or settled).

BARC 2016 Dues Now Payable

Most BARC memberships expire December 31, 2015. Free memberships for hams newly licensed in 2015 expire 12 months from the end of the month first licensed. Free memberships for new hams licensed in November or December are good through December 31, 2016. New members joining in November or December pay \$15 for 2016 dues.

- Annual membership renewal is \$15 per member and \$3 for each additional family member living at the same address.
- BARC members first licensed in 2015 will be notified by the Treasurer of their free membership expiration date. Such members will pay a prorated amount of dues for the 2016 membership year.
- 2015 memberships become delinquent if not renewed by the February meeting. The 2016 Membership Directory will include all members who have renewed or joined by March 1, 2016.
