## Bellbrook Sugar Maple Festival Parade


- BARC will be assisting the Bellbrook Sugar Maple Festival Parade Committee again this year on Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>, by helping to direct parade participants to their line-up positions & by providing communications support for coordination, safety and security. As usual, we need around 12 operators to effectively cover this BARC public service event. New hams are especially encouraged to come out and work with an experience BARC member to become familiar with public service support activities and procedures.
- NOTE: The SMF Parade starts one hour earlier this year—at 10:30 AM. Meet at 9:00 AM in the parking lot of the Bellbrook Community Church on West Franklin Street at Vemco Drive to pick up a

line-up sheet, your assignment and a safety vests. Operators need to be at their assigned positions by 9:30 AM. The parade will begin at 10:30 AM. Vehicular units on Vemco will "roll-out" at apx 10:15 AM in order to be at the merging point (intersection of West Franklin St and Little Sugarcreek Road) by 10:30.

- This is a community service project that BARC has supported since the first Sugar Maple Parade in 1979. So please come out and do your part to make this another successful BARC public service event.
- We will use BARC's primary simplex frequency 147.405 for parade operations again this year.
- The parade will be held rain or shine unless there is a severe thunderstorm. Weather should be nice but be prepared--bring your rain gear and a plastic bag to protect your HT, just in case. Also, bring a fully charged battery or a spare battery and an appropriate antenna for your radio.

## Ohio ARES NVIS Antenna Day

- Also on Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>, is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual NVIS Antenna Day sponsored by Ohio Section ARES. The purpose of this event is for ARES group, radio clubs and individual hams to set up and test performance of different configurations of NVIS type antennas by communicating with other hams across Ohio and surrounding states also using NVIS antennas.

## ARRL 2016 National Parks on the Air

In 2016, the National Park Service (NPS) will celebrate its 100th anniversary, and radio amateurs will be able to help mark the occasion with the ARRL National Parks on the Air (NPOTA) event. The fun began at 0000 UTC on January 1, 2016.

NPOTA will run throughout 2016, with activity promoted and encouraged from each of the more than 430 official NPS administrative units and affiliated areas across the US. This includes all 59 National Parks as well as National Battlefields, Historic Sites, Memorials, Preserves, Reserves, Rivers, Seashores, National Scenic Trails, and other units

The program will have two participation tracks — Chasers and Activators. Chasers will simply attempt to make contact with operators in as many of the NPS units as possible. Activators will attempt to activate as many of the units as possible. NPOTA participants may serve in both roles. Chaser and Activator totals will be tracked via an online "Leader Board" based on LoTW data, just as was done during the ARRL Centennial QSO Party. ## Planning Group Notes—March 3rd

## The Meeting was called to order at 7:31 by the President.

Communication center Battery Back-Up. Greg Goffe N8DRG reports that the system is almost ready to install pending completion of some other projects currently in progress.

**Generator and gravel bed at repeater site.** The generator and gravel bed project will resume/commence this spring.

**Surplus Radios Stored in the Trailer.** This project will also resume this spring.

Rooftop Antenna Project. Fred Stone will convene a meeting to finalize the plan. He will then communicate the plan the larger Planning Group. It was suggested that the coaxial cable be cut now in preparation for the project completion. A counter suggestion was offered to cut the cable closer to when it was needed to alleviate the need to store the cut cable - thus reducing the risk of damage to the cable. It was also noted that we have enough cable conduit pieces for the run up to the roof. It was noted, however, that longer pieces of conduit would require fewer pipe couplers, thus reducing the cost.

**Club Equipment Insurance.** Fred Stone is working on updated pricing on BARC's insured equipment.

Communication Center HF Equipment. Eric Vinande, Greg Goffe and Ken Gunton had met earlier and formulated a proposal for the communication center HF Radio upgrades. A written proposal was provided to members present.

#### Proposal Highlights:

- Station 1-3: Purchase Yaesu FT-DX1200 radios for each station or repair some existing equipment
- Station 4: Purchase the new Icom IC-7300 SDR
- Finance in part by the sale of existing HF radios in the stations including the Drake equipment in Station 4. Equipment sales could yield up to \$3800.00

There was consensus among the planning group to sell existing station equipment including the Drake equipment. Additional funds through member donations or existing club accounts will be pursued. New equipment purchases however will be made with consent of the general membership.

The planning group discussed the plan resulting in a consensus to pursue purchasing the same HF rig for all four stations for ease of member training and use – particularly the Icom IC7300 SDR. Purchase one IC7300 to evaluate now and the remaining three over a period of time. Expected availability for this newly released radio is late April 2016.

#### Way Forward:

- Ken Gunton will make a brief presentation at the March Dinner Meeting for club approval to purchase the first Icom IC7300 SDR rig.
- Paul Sharp will contact R&L immediately to add BARC to the waiting list for the IC7300. A deposit may be necessary but will be applied to the purchase. If the club does not purchase the radio the deposit will serve as a credit to the BARC's R&L account - Paul will verify this.
- Assuming club approval to purchase; there are sufficient club funds to purchase of the IC7300 pending the sale of the Drake and other existing station equipment.
- Some of the existing station equipment to sell is in need of repair. Eric and Ken will decide if said equipment should be sold as-is or repaired first.
- Eric will market the overall plan to the club and solicit donations toward the effort.

HT Radios for newly licensed BARC members. Eric Vinande reports that two additional radios have been purchased and can be programmed within five minutes.

**Clubhouse Tools.** Chris Stauter and Paul Sharp purchased a variety of new tools for the clubhouse. The tools should be permanently marked as BARC property.

**Generator Status.** Chris Stauter will evaluate the generator as warmer weather sets in. John King KA8OYH has offered to donate a 50lb propane tank.

**Door for School Roof Access.** This project would be led/handled by the school and currently there is nothing significant to report. Henry Bussey W8TOG is BARC's point of contact for the school.

Club Treasury and Membership Dues Status. Paul reports that there is approximately \$5000 in the bank. As of this evening 85 full members and 4 associate members have paid their dues. The information is being provided to Russ Roysden N8NPT for the member directory. Members paying dues after today will, necessarily, not be included in the printed directory.

**Antenna Rotor Project.** Jim Tiderman N8IDS delivered BARC's two remaining refurbished rotors at the February General Membership meeting. Paul has paid Jim for the rotors.

**BARC's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.** Eric Vinande is continuing to plan BARC's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary special event.

**Adjournment.** The president adjourned the meeting at approximately 9PM.
