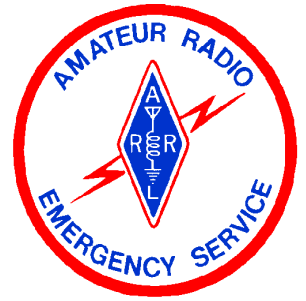

[Bellbrook Fire Department Open House](#)

The 2016 annual Bellbrook Fire Department Open House was held on Tuesday, October 11th, from 6:00 to 9:00 PM, at Station 22, 4254 West Franklin Street (northwest corner West Franklin St & North Linda Dr). BARC was represented by Fred Stone and Jim Lusk who set up and manned a BARC display table in the Training Room. Several BARC members visited BFD Station 22 during the event.

Fred Stone, BARC's Emergency Preparedness Coordinator and liaison with Bellbrook public safety agencies, coordinated BARC's participation. The Bellbrook Fire Department Open House is held annually during National Fire Prevention Week

BARC's primary purpose for participating is to promote amateur radio in general and the Bellbrook Amateur Radio Club in particular—especially BARC's relationship with the Bellbrook Fire and Police departments in providing auxiliary communications support in times of disaster or other communication emergencies.

[ARRL 2016 National Parks on the Air](#)

As the National Park Service (NPS) celebrates its 100th anniversary this year, radio amateurs will help mark the occasion with the ARRL National Parks on the Air (NPOTA) event [began January 1st 2016].

NPOTA will run throughout the year with activity promoted and encouraged from each of the more than 430 official NPS administrative units and affiliated areas across the US. This includes all 59 National Parks as well as National Battlefields, Historic Sites, Memorials, Preserves, Reserves, Rivers, Seashores, National Scenic Trails, and other units.

The program will have two participation tracks — Chasers and Activators. Chasers will simply attempt to make contact with operators in as many of the NPS units as possible. Activators will attempt to activate as many of the units as possible. NPOTA participants may serve in both roles. Chaser and Activator totals will be tracked via an online "Leader Board" based on LoTW data, just as was done during the ARRL Centennial QSO Party. Communication Center Coordinator Report: Eric Vinande KG8NFJ reports that BARC is registered (by Henry Bussey W8TOG with both the Electronic QSL card center (eQSL) and Logbook of the World (LOTW).

Education & Emergency Coordinator Report. Fred Stone W8LLY reports the following:

- The **Greene County Amateur Radio License Courses** began last Sunday evening, September 11th.
 - Technician Class Course at the BARC Clubhouse – five students present with two to three additional expected.
 - General Class Course at the Beavercreek Township Fire Station 1 – six students present.
 - Extra Class Course at the Fairborn Fire Station 2 – four students present.
- The annual Ohio **Simulated Emergency Test (SET)** is scheduled for Saturday, 1 October 2016. No ‘exotic’ scenario is planned this year. BARC Comm Center will be activated so members will be needed to man stations at the clubhouse and at the various served agencies

Communication Center Antenna Project. A meeting was held last Thursday. There was good input by members present including Ken Moak KM8AM. Ken will assist in coordinating the effort. The basic plan was well accepted and accommodates emergency communications (primary); casual operating; DX’ing; and Contesting. Ken Moak’s slides are available upon request for additional details.

Ohio State Parks On the Air (OSPOTA). OSPOTA was held on Saturday 10 September at John Bryan State Park. Ken Moak, who co-coordinated the effort with Fred Stone, reports that BARC had a “fantastic” showing with 15 attendees - which is greater than 10% of the membership. Thirty-Five Ohio State Parks were contacted (out of 75) with 169 QSO’s. This is an excellent result considering its BARC’s first OSPOTA event. There was a ½ to 1-hour shutdown for thunderstorms during the 8 hour event.

The Meeting was called to order at 7:33 by the President.

UDRC, Universal Digital Radio Controller. Russ Roysden confirms that internet access will be needed for UDRC functionality. Russ and Fred will talk to the repeater site owner about a permanent internet connection – timing will be at the discretion of the site owner.

QRM on the 440 repeater. POC Russ has heard no noise lately and worked fine on the BARC-Net a couple weeks ago. No tone has been applied to the system. The 440 repeater is to be sent in for a firmware upgrade but Russ will wait until the 2m “change of season” noise clears up so it will be available as a BARC-Net backup. A 2m repeater tone may still be an option especially if it can be activated/deactivated remotely.

IRLP and/or EchoLink. Either IRLP or EchoLink are easy to install once internet is established. One or both could be installed. Abuse of the system is still a concern. Either can be enabled/disabled remotely; particularly in case of abuse, or for emergency repeater use. IRLP can be used only with a radio, versus EchoLink which can be accessed with either a radio or a personal computer. Thus IRLP is less prone to abuse; accidental or intentional. The planning group consents to installing one or both provided remote access is available to control the system. The repeater coordinator plus several others should be granted access for control.

BARC T-shirt order. POC Russ Roysden reports the following T-shirt pricing information.

Paul will take orders and collect payment; Russ will place the order with the vendor.

Communication Center Coordinator. Eric Vinande has stepped down as Communication Center Coordinator due to family obligations. Ken Moak has volunteered to fill the position with Karen Moak handling the Club’s Logging and QSL cards. The planning group gives its recommendation that Ken and Karen be approved for their respective positions by membership vote at the next General Meeting (October).

Google Drive for BARC File Sharing. Jason Bowman discussed several options for file sharing using google Drive. The options centered around a levels of security; i.e. view only, download, or full read/edit access. For best security, members wishing access should open an individual google account. A separate folder with executive, coordinator, or subcommittee access only could be set up for the more sensitive club business information.

BARC Surplus Antennas Status. POC's Chris Stauter and Henry Bussey W8TOG. Chris reports that he has two 2m 13 or 14 element beams and a homemade quad antenna stored at his home. The coal bin still has to be inventoried.

BARC was beat by one other club (at Kiser Lake) who had twice the QSO's and a mobile station. Ken described the lessons learned for better

BARC performance next year. Thanks to Chris Stauter for camping out overnight to monitor the equipment.

Antenna Project Update. Ken Moak reported on the Antenna Project Ad-Hoc Committee's plan and much discussion ensued. Included was a recommendation to reduce the number of radios needed in the club stations, but there was a concern that the Club's Emergency Communication (EMCOMM) needs may not be met. EMCOMM coordinator Fred Stone will brief Ken on the Club's EMCOMM requirements/plan and history in order to ensure that the committee's plan serves BARC's support of Bellbrook/Sugarcreek Township, Greene County and GCARES adequately.

Ken has documented the Antenna Committee's recommendations which is available for member review, or presentation at a future General Membership meeting. The discussion concluded with a consensus among the members present tonight to proceed with the general project plan. Additionally, a brief discussion on how to attract club members to utilize the stations followed; adequate training with simplified user friendly station set-up was cited.
