BARC / Audenarde Belgium Event— The Ohio Bridge Commemoration (05/27)

BARC has been invited to represent Ohio and United States hams by communicating with Belgium hams Sunday 27 May during the 100 year commemoration of The Ohio Bridge in Audenarde, Belgium.

Ken Gunton volunteered to be BARC's Coordinator for this event and will have a report at Thursday's meeting. BARC member Bob Leach will be in Belgium during this event to coordinate with local hams there.

The bridge commemorates the difficult crossing and bridging of the River Schelde by the 37th "Buckeye" Division's 315th Engineers on November 2nd 1918. The people of Ohio built the bridge in recognition of the achievement and decorated it with life sized

statues of American Bison. The present bridge was rebuilt by the people of Ohio after the first was destroyed in World War Two.

BARC Antennas Study Group (04/23)

The BARC Antenna Study Group, part of BARC's Continuing Education Program, will re-start on **Monday 04 June at 7:00 PM** at the Clubhouse after pausing for Hamvention, Memorial Day weekend and several scheduling set-backs.

This is a presentation and discussion series on basic antenna fundamentals with minimal math and theory. The Antenna Study Group will meet for a couple hours or so weekly on Monday evenings for two or three weeks—a little longer if needed.

Scope of this Special Interest Group (SIG) will be practical HF and VHF/UHF monoband and multiband horizontal and vertical antenna designs including wire antennas, beams, supports, feedlines, baluns, tuners/matching units, etc., and how to calculate element lengths for constructing antennas. And, about why and when to use different designs for different objectives.

The last time we did this Antennas Study Group, we followed-up the 'classroom' sessions with some field trips to survey some home QTH sites for those interested in erecting antennas.

Call to Order. The President called the meeting to order at 7:31 pm and opened with the US Pledge of Allegiance.

A moment of silence was held for Barbara Bush, and Silent Key Art Bell W6OBB

Meeting Program. “*Overview of Antenna Analyzers*” by Mike Suhar W8RKO

The president recognized Fred Stone W8LLY for a milestone 80th birthday this month and his role as the principal Founding Father of the Bellbrook Amateur Radio Club.

In the wake of the Xenia Tornado disaster of 3 April 1974, Bellbrook and Sugar creek Township jointly created a Disaster Plan and Fred became the Communication Coordinator. Fred then found several local hams to form a Communication Support Group.

In mid-1975, Fred approached Clyde Schaffnit KB8HV (SK) about the idea of starting a club. Fred and Clyde sought out radio amateurs in the area including Henry Bussey W8TOG, Ron Sprauer WD8AZC and Mary Ann Stone K8RCJ. In all, twenty charter members went on to establish BARC as the first amateur radio club in Greene County Ohio. BARC was officially founded July 4th, 1976. A big round of applause and many thanks went out to Fred for his birthday and for bringing us **BARC!!**

Approval of Club Meeting Minutes. Jim Totten put forth the motion to approve the February 2018 General Membership Meeting minutes as written. James Lusk KC8EFD offered a second to the motion. The motion passed by a vote of the membership in attendance. (*Note: No business was conducted at the March 2018 Annual Dinner Meeting.*)

BARC Financial Report. Treasurer Paul Sharp was on vacation during the April meeting, thus no financial summary to present. The president did report that funds for a new clubhouse refrigerator were approved at the last planning meeting. Deputy Treasurer Henry Bussey W8TOG and Tink Siwecki KD8NUA will handle the purchase.

Clubhouse Electronic Service Bench. Tim Procnian N8NQH is leading this effort in cooperation with Clubhouse Coordinator James Lusk. Lynn Rogers KE8FLL, Chris Stauter KD8APN and John Rawson KE8HUV will also assist.

The Meeting was called to order at 7:30 by the President.

Complementary Radios to New Hams: Tim Proconiar N8NQH reported on his test results for spurious emissions from the imported radios. He found that 5 of nine units failed. This is consistent with ARRL's reported of a 60% fail rate. He will

present the results at the May General Membership Meeting.

May General Membership Meeting Rescheduled.

A member recommended that the BARC May meeting be rescheduled to the fourth Thursday so as not to be a hardship on members needing to prepare for volunteer activities for Hamvention. Another member stated that would be helpful. A general consensus in agreement with the recommendation was demonstrated by a show of hands. Thus, the BARC May meeting will be held on the 24th of May. This will not conflict with Movie Night as there are five Thursdays in May. BARC Lunch will be cancelled too.

Electronic Service Bench. Project lead Tim Proconiar reported on the status of the bench project. He has established a timeline for completion. He discussed the historical background on the bench plans. Tim was thankful that Ken Moak KM8AM revived the idea. Approval to proceed was granted at the April Planning Group Meeting. He stated that the project would first be to build and equip the bench. Then, secondly, hold a periodic "Tech Night"; some with and some without technical presentations. Tim proposes the 2nd Thursday to serve as "Tech Night". This would likely have to start in July since the 2nd Thursday of June will be the last Field Day Committee meeting. Service bench details:

- A solid wooden door to serve as the benchtop was donated by Lynn Rogers.
- Tim will generate a list of suggested bench equipment.
- An Oscilloscope has been donated.
- A member offered a high amperage DC power supply.
- Tim will provide a Power Distribution Block.

The bench location was discussed, and the Group decided to locate the bench by the rear clubhouse door near the stations. Lynn Rogers offered a set of adjustable legs for the benchtop (door). Otherwise the Group authorized Tim to purchase a set of legs for around \$60.

Clubhouse 'Hospitality Station' Refrigerator. The refrigerator has been purchased and is scheduled to be delivered on May 8th. Chris Stauter will remove the old refrigerator.

Contesting: Ken Gunton W8ASA reports in absentia:

1) Ohio Bridge/Belgium/WWI 100th Anniversary.

Ken's counterpart in Belgium is supposed to make some decision this week or next about how this "contest" is going to play out.

2) Contest University. Ken recommends that anyone seriously interested in contesting should attend Contest University, which takes place during Hamvention. It's well worth attending, and you will learn things about operating that even apply outside of contesting.
