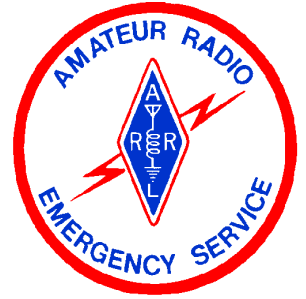

### Bellbrook Sugar Maple Festival Parade (04/27)

BARC will be supporting the 41<sup>st</sup> Annual Bellbrook Sugar Maple Festival Parade Committee on **Saturday, April 27<sup>th</sup>**, by helping to direct parade participants to their line-up positions & by providing

communications support for coordination, safety and security. As usual, we need around 12-16 operators to effectively cover this BARC public service event.

**New hams** are especially encouraged to come out and work with an experience BARC member to become familiar with public service support activities and procedures.

The SMF Parade starts at 10:30 AM. Operators will meet at **9:00 AM** in the parking lot of the Bellbrook Community Church on West Franklin Street at Vemco Drive to pick up a line-up sheet, an assignment and a safety vests. Operators need to be at their assigned positions by 9:30 AM to get parade participants lined up by 10:15 AM. Vehicular units on Vemco will "roll-out" at apx 10:15 AM in order to be at the merging point (intersection of West Franklin St and Little Sugarcreek Road) by 10:30 AM.

This is a community service project that BARC has supported since the first Sugar Maple Parade in 1979. So please come out and do your part to make this another successful BARC public service event.

We will use BARC's primary simplex frequency **147.405** for parade operations again this year.

The parade will be held rain or shine unless there is a severe thunderstorm. Weather is unknown at this time so come prepared--bring your rain gear and a

plastic bag to protect your HT, just in case. Also, bring a fully charged battery or a spare battery and an appropriate antenna for your radio.

**The Meeting was called to order at 7:31 by the President.**

**Field Day (FD).** No Report.

Russ Roysden stated that he will bring breakfast biscuits.

**Public Service**

• **Sugar Maple Festival Parade - 27 April 2019.**

Don Parker has set out an e-mail to the club. One additional volunteer is needed. Roger Parrett will handle the pacing. Roger Parrett, Greg Goffe, and Ken Gunton will set up the new antenna system.

• **Little Miami River Kleeners (LMRK).** No report; event occurs June 8<sup>th</sup> 0830-1200 ET (BARC provides communication support--need volunteers.

**Repeater.** Russ Roysden has announced that the opening of the second location of the family business is complete; thus, he can now assume leadership of the repeater site refurbishment effort and that he intends to remain the repeater coordinator. Russ and Tim Proconiar N8NQH will be meeting at the repeater site at 2PM this Sunday to verify the items and quantities that need to be purchased. Tim N8NQH, via email, assured the group (after a doubt was raised) that LMR400 coaxial cable is indeed double shielded.

Fred Stone reports that the repeater site owner has contacted him and is ready to install BARC's new antennas and hardline. At that time a BARC 2-m port will be made available to the West Central Ohio Amateur Radio Association (WCOARA) for a remote receiver. This is in exchange for the 1/2" hardline donated to BARC. He also is planning to install a generator at the tower site and a new larger building that will include space for the BARC and GCARES repeaters and associated equipment.

**Clubhouse Space Utilization.**

• **Tables.** At a prior meeting, replacement of the eclectic mix of clubhouse tables was proposed. A sample table was purchased by Paul Sharp. It would be desirable if a single table could accommodate three chairs.

• **Video Projector.** Hanging the club's video projector would free up space. We will seek Lynn Roger's advice and assessment on the best way to mount the projector to the ceiling.

**"Ham Skills" Classes.** Members stated in a prior meeting that they would prefer not to hold the classes on an additional Thursday night in order to avoid conflicts with many other ham activities that occur on Thursdays. Organizers are assessing what day works out best for most people. Alternately Trevor Clarke and Tim Proconiar has offered-up some time at the beginning of Tech-Night for the "Skills" class. In this way members seeking both offerings could cover both in only one evening.

**Sunday Evening BARC net.** Paul Sharp reports that a new net controller is needed. He will reach out to John Westerkamp as a potential recruit.

**Donated Towers.** John Kings' tower is no longer available as his house has sold. Russ Roysden's towers sections (non-erected) are still available. Fred will advertise Russ' tower sections on the local reflectors.

**Financial Report:** Paul Sharp reports a current all funds balance of \$7500. BARC has donated \$100 to the Bellbrook Beautification organization. Paul is no longer actively collecting renewal dues; hence the BARC member directory has been published and distributed electronically. A few paper copies will be available. Thanks to Russ Roysden for assembling the directories.
